Robert studied architecture at Cambridge University and Harvard, US. He was appointed Director in 1997 following 8 years architectural experience within the practice. He has worked with Eric Parry for over 19 years.

Robert has worked on a number of the practice's award winning schemes, most notably Foundress Court for Pembroke College, Cambridge, the phased refurbishment of the prestigious Mandarin Oriental Hyde Park and the office building at 30 Finsbury Square, which won numerous awards on its completion in 2003.

He has lead the £36m Renewal of St Martin-in-the-Fields which included the refurbishment and conservation of James Gibbs' Grade I listed church and crypt, which reopened in October 2007 and also the reconstruction of the below ground spaces, rationalisation and extension of the Grade II* listed John Nash terrace and reordering of the publicly accessible spaces.

He has also worked on the new mixed use building at 23 Savile Row, a major development at 120 Fenchurch Street and proposals for Selfridges & Co. on Oxford Street.

Before joining the practice Robert worked on education projects at Nicholas Hare Architects and for Theatre Projects in their London office.

Robert has taught in architecture studios at both the University of North London and University of Cambridge.
