Christopher studied at the Mackintosh School of Architecture, Glasgow and has worked in Manchester and the Netherlands. He joined Eric Parry Architects in 2004 and was appointed Associate in 2011.

Christopher's first project within the practice was the renewal project at St Martin-in-the-Fields in Trafalgar Square, where he was the Project Architect for the renovation and remodelling of John Nash's Grade II* buildings housing the Vicarage, the Enterprise offices and The Connection at St Martin's.

Building on his experience gained at St Martin-in-the-Fields Christopher worked on the Holburne Museum in Bath where he was the Project Architect for the refurbishment and extension of the Grade I listed building.

In this way he was able to continue to develop the knowledge base gained at St Martin's and provide lessons learnt to the rest of the team. He is currently working towards accreditation to the RIBA Conservation Register.

Recently Chris has been responsible for the planning application for 9 Millbank and Ergon House Project for St Edward Homes which includes luxury apartments in the listed former ICI headquarters.

Before joining the practice, Christopher worked for East, an architecture, landscape and urban design office. He worked on various urban framework plans, including one for Woolwich, East London, and on several landscape and public realm projects.

Christopher also spent three years working in the Netherlands, including with Maccreanor Lavington, where he was involved in various built housing schemes. Whilst in Holland he won the European 6 housing design competition in Lelystad.
