Takayuki Nakajima studied architecture at FADU, Universidad de Buenos Aires from 1987 to 1992 and joined Eric Parry Architects in spring 2014 and was appointed associate in 2017. Takayuki is currently working on the new headquarters for Cambridge Assessment, in Cambridge.

Before joining the practice, Takayuki worked at David Chipperfield Architects between 2001 and 2006 as the project architect of the New City of Justice in Barcelona, (2010 RIBA EU Award) the New BBC Scotland at Pacific Quay, Glasgow (2008 RIBA National Award) among other projects. Between 2006 and 2008 he worked with KPF (Kohn Pedersen Fox) as the Senior Design Architect for the Le Varesine Landmark Office Tower and mixed-use project in Porta Nuova, Milan, and at Hamiltons Architects (now FL) as the Associate Design Architect for The Exchange, Greengate Embankment in Manchester and Marcol House in London.

From 2008 to 2013 he established his own practice (MTMN arquitectos) in Buenos Aires with partner Malca Mizrahi working on and completing several projects in Argentina, among them a recently finished 3000sq m retail complex in the resort city of Carilo, south of Buenos Aires province.

He has taught at the Universidad de Buenos Aires, Universidad Torcuato Di Tella, Buenos Aires, the Universitat Internacional de Catalunya in Barcelona, Spain and he has also been a visiting critic at the Architectural Association and The Bartlett School of Architecture in London.
